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I really hope I can make this a recurring thing.

This is some the best stuff that happened around the PinePhone this week. Commentary in Italics.

Software: releases and improvements

- Phosh 0.4.0 Release. Already in Mobian, this release brings a really neat feature: You can now
 automatically scale apps that are otherwise too big using the command scale-to-fit scale-to-fit scale-to-fit scale-to-fit gnome-calendar on . Edit 5th July 2020: Apparently, scale-to-fit is not in every distro automatically with the 0.4.0 release, as it is not in postmarketOS at the
 time of writing this remark.
- GloDroid 0.3.0 pre-Release. I am curious whether this is better than the previous release.
- · UBports Camera might work soon. Please don't expect premium smartphone photography.
- Manjaro ARM Alpha1 of Phosh for PinePhone and PineTabl. After putting out five Alpha releases of Manjaro featuring Plasma Mobile, Manjaro now release a Phosh based image. BTW: A couple of days earlier, a new ArchLinux ARM image was released, too.
- AVMultiPhone claims 20 hours battery life on PinePhone (german, linuxnews.de). AVMultiPhone is a
 postmarketOS-based distribution which looks more like your average desktop than a mobile OS. I
 could not get myself to try it yet, but that battery life sounds tempting. In a recent blog post, the
 creator sets out a 500 Euro bounty for getting the "wake up on phone call while in deep sleep" to
 work.

Worth reading

- Non-static Pinephone Review roiredideas. This seems to be the only sensible way to review it
 right now. There is so much software and so much progress on so many ends, that it is just
 impossible to reach anything close to a verdict. My experience with PureOS differs, but every project
 puts out a wonky image once in a while. Also: If you want a dark theme on Phosh-based
 distributions, gsettings set org.gnome.desktop.interface gtk-theme "Adwaita-dark"
 is your friend.
- Install #openSUSE on a #Pinephone device victorhckinthefreeworld.com. Interesting interview, even if you don't really care about openSUSE.

 - o I listened to a Podcast in the Gnome Podcasts app,
 - I managed to install gnome-passwordsafe from flathub, and got signed in to Nextcloud using Gnome Accounts, ticking two boxes on my "daily driver" check list,
 - I installed nheko to find out that the squeekboard keyboard does not work with it and then logged in to fractal to have non-encrypted Matrix.



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Did you notice that there's been a countdown on the recent Weekly Updates? If so, this post may not really surprise you all that much. Please read it anyway:-)

Boredom and Scarcity of Time

If you've been reading the Weekly Updates on this blog for a while, you may remember that I changed the name earlier this year, and tried to change things up a little, because I felt a bit bored and hoped that I would be able to change these regular posts into something that would feel more fun again and less of a chore.

I did not really manage to pull that off. In addition to that, the job change that temporarily coincided with the name change, has made my life a lot more busy, leaving less time and resources to doing fun stuff, to experiment with Linux phones and so on.

Thus, I not only felt increasingly bored by the task of collecting a link list, but also, the thought of "What else could I do with these three to four hours?" has become increasingly hard to shut down. Therefore, I pondered quitting after 128 weekly updates to the end of this year, which is the number the countdown is counting towards.

Current Events and the Near Future

Now, there's been another development this week: A close family member who seemed to had recovered from a bad illness is sadly ill again. This changes things – it's now not just about "Would this time better spent on LinuxPhoneApps.org/writing a how-to/doing \$thing" it's also "Well, I maybe should rather interact with/do something for this person".

That's not the only thing. With increased stress levels, I really need to reduce my social media use, as it simply does not make me feel better overall and also likely eats an uncomfortably large amount of time. This includes no longer trying to follow Reddit and some forums via feeds, and using less of Mastodon and Twitter. (I might even drop Twitter and Mastodon almost entirely, and try follow a handful relevant accounts via RSS.)


and slightly crazy due to my own changes
